# 1 Purpose of this Paper

The Department of Climate, Energy and the Environment (DCEE) has launched a public consultation in the context of the development of Ireland's new Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) National Implementation Plan (NIP).

This will be Ireland's third SDGs National Implementation Plan and will build on the progress made in the previous [SDG National Implementation Plans](#).

This open public consultation process is one of several different strands of consultation, both online and in-person, taking place to assist in developing the new NIP and ensure that the widest range of stakeholders are reached.

## 2 Context

The Programme for Government sets out that the Government is committed to accelerating Ireland's progress toward the 17 SDGs by 2030, addressing critical areas such as poverty eradication, climate action, and improved living standards for all and commits to: -

- adopt a coordinated approach to drive impactful action both at home and abroad and
- to implement a Whole-of-Government Strategy to fully integrate the SDGs into national policies and initiatives, ensuring that each goal is actively pursued across all levels of government.

The Programme for Government also commits to supporting the work of young people to help their communities and support the SDGs.

Ireland's [Second National Implementation Plan \(NIP\) for the Sustainable Development Goals 2022-2024](#) was published on 5 October 2022 and its implementation is ongoing.

The NIP sets out five strategic objectives and 51 actions, with 119 individual measures to increase Ireland's ambition and strengthen implementation structures to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). It also incorporates 23 external actions from other National Plans or Strategies which contribute to and are complementary to the objectives of this Plan and which have been included for coherence including actions from the: -

<p><b>Identify and apply for funding to obtain OECD support in the areas of policy coherency (Action 24)</b></p>	<p>The OECD Multi Country Project with Portugal and Belgium was completed in September 2025 and for Ireland focused on "Building Policy Coherence for Sustainable Development (PCSD) across national and local government in Ireland". The <a href="#">OECD Policy Coherence Scan of Ireland</a> was published in July 2025.</p>
<p><b>Incorporate the SDGs into new Guidelines and the 2025 Local Authority Corporate Plans (Action 30)</b></p>	<p>The SDGs were incorporated into the <a href="#">Guidelines for Local Authority Corporate Plans</a> in 2024</p>
<p><b>Supporting a 'whole of society' approach to achieving the SDGs through the National Stakeholder Forum (Action 34)</b></p>	<p>The <a href="#">SDG National Stakeholder Forum</a> was established to provide a mechanism for stakeholders from all sectors to discuss and workshop innovative ideas and solutions for achieving and communicating the SDGs in Ireland. The Forum aims for open and inclusive engagement with representatives across different stakeholder groups. Several successful fora have taken place to date covering a range of themes from Leaving No One Behind to Education for Sustainable Development, the role of Business in achieving the SDGs and Biodiversity and Community.</p>

	<p>A number of SDG Forum Committees have been appointed in recent years from a variety of sectors and backgrounds to develop the work plan for the Forum and to design a well-publicised, accessible, and inclusive National Stakeholder Forum format that ensures no one is left behind.</p> <p>A new SDG National Stakeholder Committee will be appointed in December 2025 for a period of 18 months.</p>
<p><b>SDG Champions Programme (Action 35)</b></p>	<p>The <a href="#">SDG Champions Programme</a> was established to raise public awareness of the SDGs through partnership and promotion. The Champions, through their organisational practices, illustrate ways in which organisations and individuals can contribute to achieving the SDGs.</p> <p>An improved SDG Champions Programme was launched in 2023 with more clearly defined roles, responsibilities and key events and tasks. Resources were also developed including SDG Champion brand assets, reporting templates and an information and communications pack. new section for the SDG Champions is also live on the SDG Geohive where quarterly reports and champions activities will be showcased.</p> <p>To date 54 organisations have been appointed as SDG Champions. The most recent call for Applications opened in June 2025 for the 2025-2027 Programme which will run for 18 months, with the new Champions soon to be announced.</p> <p>Many SDG Champions have opted to become SDG Ambassadors after their tenure as Champions end, continuing to contribute to the promotion, awareness-raising, and implementation of the SDGs.</p>

<p><b>Further development of Ireland’s SDG GeoHive (Action 36)</b></p>	<p>Work has been completed on a review in conjunction with Tailte Éireann, CSO, and ESRI and the new version of the <a href="#">Geohive</a> launched. Further development of the Geohive will continue, to include other elements, to reflect national initiatives, regional and local initiatives, etc.</p>
<p><b>Further integration of the SDGs into the SuperValu TidyTowns Competition (Action 42)</b></p>	<p>To create and increase awareness of the Sustainable Development Goals the Department of Climate, Environment and Energy sponsors four SDG prizes in the Tidy Towns competition including a best entry from a village/small town, best entry from a large town or urban centre, an overall runner-up prize and a special youth award. The SDG Prizes will be further developed for 2026.</p>
<p><b>SDG Week (Action 45)</b></p>	<p><a href="#">Sustainable Development Goals Week</a> marks the anniversary of the day the SDGs were agreed in 2015. The week comprises activities to celebrate and raise awareness of the SDGs. SDG Week in Ireland forms part of the wider European Sustainable Development Week. Ireland’s first SDG Week was held in September 2022 to celebrate and raise awareness of the SDGs and in 2024 there almost 200 events registered in Ireland. This year’s SDG Week ran from 19-28<sup>th</sup> September 2025 with over 100 events registered on the calendar at <a href="https://esdn.eu/esdw">https://esdn.eu/esdw</a></p>
<p><b>Embedding the principle of Leave no One Behind (Action 51)</b></p>	<p>The first SDG National Stakeholder forum of 2023 was dedicated to developing a definition of Leaving No One Behind from an Irish perspective. The definition of leaving no one behind agreed on the day is “An inclusive and empathetic society that empowers everyone to engage with and be represented in decision-making, accelerating dignity and enabling</p>

It provides an overview of Ireland’s legislation, institutional mechanisms, policy tools and processes for promoting PCSD, identifying strengths, weaknesses and possible ways forward.

4. Are you satisfied that the Governance structures in place are sufficient to ensure increased policy coherence for sustainable development across all levels of government?
5. Stakeholder Engagement - what is working well and what needs to be further developed e.g. better reaching the furthest behind first?
6. How can youth voices and the voices of groups identified as being in danger of being left behind best be included?
7. Are there specific actions that should be considered for inclusion? If so, please specify.
8. Are there new topics or areas which need to be considered for inclusion (e.g. AI and Digitalisation, Pact for the Future, etc.)?
9. How can the monitoring and reporting framework be improved, particularly in preparation for Ireland's next Voluntary National Review?
10. What role can partnerships play in furthering the implementation of the SDGs in Ireland?
